The last picture is of Caitlin, her fiancé Eric and Caitlin's dog Aiden.

These are the images that we hold for Caitlin and her return to strength, grace and vivacious beauty.

Robert was part of the teaching staff during a small group teacher training at Spring Forest Qigong. On the first day of training he arrived distraught with terrible news of Caitlin being in ICU in critical condition following the accident. I was one of the few commuting from home and had access to my healing room that night. I did a distance healing session for Caitlin. I still recall the clear imagery I had during the session. I saw one of the other training staff, as well as Master Chunyi Lin, doing healing on Caitlin. Master Lin was specifically working on her head. The next day, Robert, now greatly relieved, shared an update with the class that Caitlin had miraculously survived a critical period of cranial bleeding and other issues. The medical staff were amazed to update her status to stable. She was now expected to survive but would be facing a long slow recovery.
